### **NPS Health Pillars**

- Face Coverings ALL adults & students
- 2. Hand Hygiene
- Health Self-Assessment
  - Every morning, an adult at home should check children for symptoms of COVID-19
  - Stay home if sick, even if vaccinated

#### NPS Health Self-assessment Tool

- .. Do you/your child have any of the following symptoms?
  - Fever (100F or higher), chills, shaking chills
  - Cough (not due to other known causes, such as a chronic cough)
  - · Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
  - New loss of taste or smell
  - Muscle aches or body aches
  - Sore throat (when in combination with other symptoms)
- Headache (when in combination with other symptoms)
- Nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea (when in combination with other symptoms)
- Fatigue (when in combination with other symptoms)
- Nasal congestion or runny nose (not due to other known causes, such as allergies and when in combination with other symptoms)
- 2. Have you/your child been told by a public health official to isolate or quarantine?

If your answer to either of the questions above is 'yes', <u>stay home and do not come</u> <u>to school</u>.

- Notify the school nurse, building principal, or principal's designee
- Staff should also follow standard procedures for reporting an absence
- If symptomatic, contact your health care provider for assessment and testing. As always, if you are experiencing a medical emergency, call 911.

### **Testing Strategies**

- Weekly COVID-19 pool testing for asymptomatic students & staff
- Symptomatic testing: Rapid testing for students & staff who develop symptoms at school.
- Test & Stay (Close contact testing): Close contacts will receive a daily rapid test performed for at least 5 days following exposure by the school nurse.
  - Designed so close contacts can stay in school vs. quarantining at home and missing school

- when they enter & leave a classroom

## Logistics for 2021-22



#### **Arrival & Dismissal**

No matter how students get to school, they will use the following spots for arrival:

- K/1- Plaza
- 2/3 Playground Blacktop
- 4- Side door by the to library
- 5- Side door by the staff parking lot

Dismissal locations for each class will be the same as arrival.

\*4th & 5th graders will be allowed to be dismissed to their youngest sibling's classroom and will be dismissed with that sibling





### **Late Arrival to School**

If a student arrives late to school, they should:

- Use the buzzer at the front entrance.
- 2. Sign in through the main office.
- Go directly to their classroom, check in with their teacher, and wash their hands!

### **Early Dismissal**

If you need to dismiss your child early:

- Parent/caregiver should use the buzzer at the front door & verbally check in with the office.
- Office staff will sign your child out, then will call your child's classroom & tell your child that they are being dismissed.
- Parent/caregiver should wait outside the front door.
- 4. A staff member will guide your child to the front door & ensure that the proper adult receives them.



### Lunch/Snack

- Outdoors When weather permits, we will eat lunch outside on the front plaza. Snack will be in the field.
- Masks Masks are removed indoors only to eat. Masks are not required outdoors.
- Seating If indoors, students stay seated. Quiet talking is allowed.
- Ventilation Windows & doors open wherever possible in indoor eating spaces.
- Cafeteria Seating Oval 12-seat tables will have 50% capacity (3 students per side staggered). Seats will be assigned.

### **Snacks and Drinking Water**

Snack will occur outside except in bad weather.

When it is time to eat, students take off their masks.

Students wash/sanitize their hands before AND after eating.

All students should bring their own

water bottles to school.

Water fountains are closed, but "bottle filling stations" are open.



### **Student Materials & Belongings**

Classroom materials & recess equipment will be shared.

Students will wash their hands **before & after** using any shared materials.

Routine cleaning and disinfecting of surfaces and materials in place.

### Some supplies will go back & forth everyday:

- ★ Mask wear a clean one each day
- ★ Extra masks
- ★ Refillable water bottle



### **Visitors & Dropping Off Items**

Visitors will have limited access to the school building during school hours.

- Parents are not permitted to volunteer in the school.
- Consistent with practices last year, aftercare staff, pre-service educators, and other
  outside service providers that are a part of our education programs will be permitted in
  the buildings & will follow NPS health and safety protocols.

If a parent/guardian/other adult must visit the building, they must wear a mask & maintain social distancing while on school property.

Go to the office to sign the visitor log & confirm that they are symptom free.

#### Adults may drop off forgotten items to students.

- Ring the doorbell & state that they are dropping off a forgotten item.
- Put the item, already labeled with the student's name & teacher's name, in the designated bin outside of the entry window.

Note: The main office will keep a detailed Visitor's Log to keep track of who has been in the building. Logs will be kept for 30 days.
