We also recommend <u>Dr. Chris Emdin</u>'s book *For White Folks that Teach in the Hood and the Rest of Y'all Too.* In this book, Dr. Emdin provides insights for how we can reflect on and evolve our classroom practices to ensure that they do not send unintended and/or negative messages to our students about their identities. He writes, "Students very quickly receive the message that they can be smart when they are not who they are. This in many ways is classroom colonialism; and it can only be addressed through a very different approach to teaching and learning."

We also wanted to give a shout out to Tom Miller and Kutztown Area High School sophomore Esmerelda Morales. Esmerelda's poem, "The Place I Grew," from Mr. Miller's creative writing class is featured in this week's *Cougar Prints* and announcements. Check it out!
