

Normalization and Power

"Normal" person/place/thing/idea	"Not Normal" person/place/thing/idea	Who gets power? (i.e. makes the decisions, gets better or more stuff, is not questioned, is praised, is listened to, gets status etc.)	Who decided what is normal?
Examples: 1. Americans are white.2. Presidents are men.3. Families have a mom and dad.	 People of Color are American. Presidents are women. Single moms or same-sex parents are families. 	 White people. Men, males in government. Families with a mom and a dad. 	 White men. White men. White men.

What is normalization?

- how people, places, things, and ideas become normal or not normal.

Example: The teacher **normalized** that flowers are red and green and any other colors are <u>not</u> normal.
