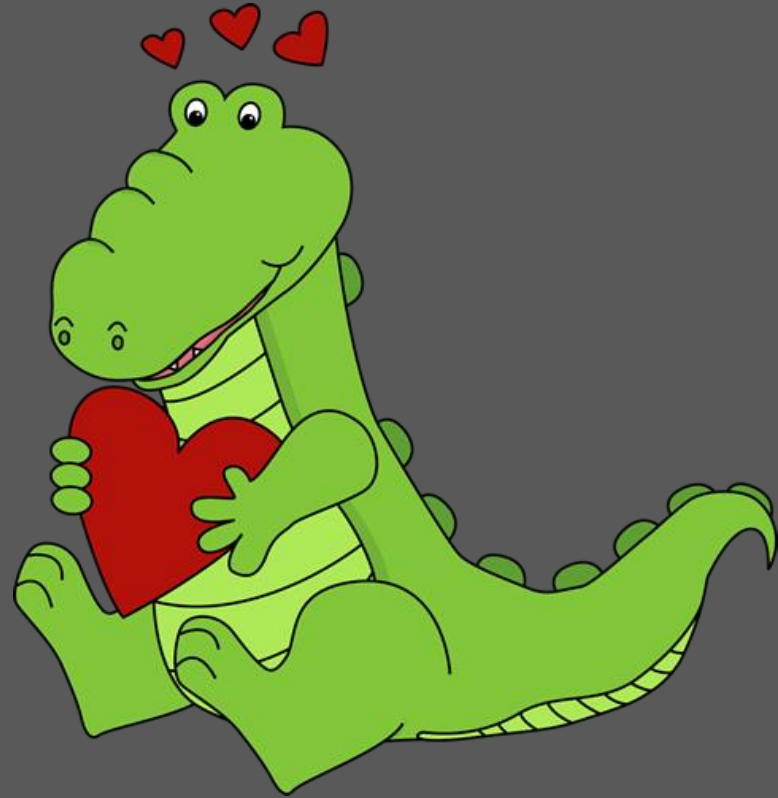
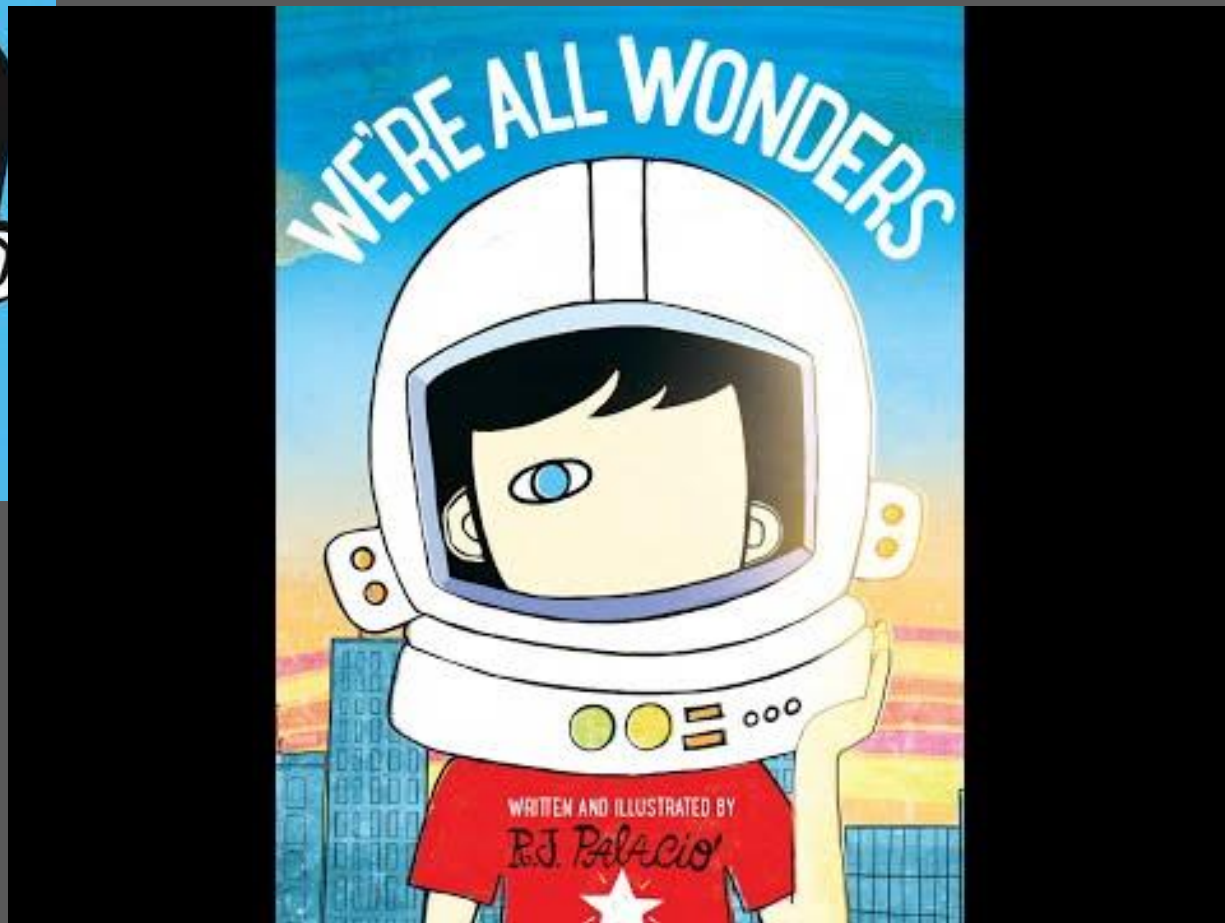

HOW DO WE SHOW KINDNESS?

Acceptance

- understanding that others are different than you
- appreciating and respecting others' differences
- You don't have to agree with everyone but you can still show respect•

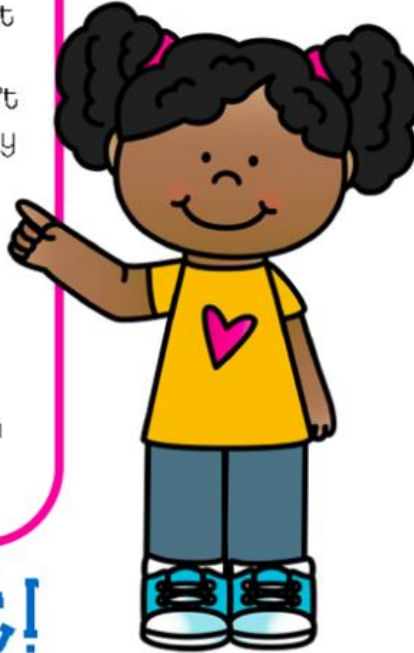

Acceptance

When you are **accepting**, you understand that others may have different feelings, behaviors, or beliefs than you. You don't judge others because they are different from you. Being accepting doesn't mean that you have to agree with everyone. Showing acceptance means appreciating and respecting differences in people.

At CGE, we show kindness. We do **NOT** tease/ make unkind comments about:

- *Someone looking different from us (someone's race or skin color)*
- *Someone's gender*
- *Someone's culture/beliefs/religion*

Consequences

- *1st offense= 3-day suspension and required participation in restorative circles upon return*
- *2nd offense= 5-day suspension, administrative school reassignment and required participation in restorative circles upon return.*
- *3rd Offense= 10-day suspension, recommendation for long-term suspension and required participation in restorative circles upon return.*
