





He presents at conferences and workshops across the U.S. and internationally and provides consultation to schools and organizations nationwide in the areas of multicultural education, diversity, equity, social justice and organizational culture.

Jack founded **White Responsibility** and the **National Anti-Racism Teach-In** to provide a platform for educators, organizers, creatives, practitioners, and religious leaders to gather and explore issues of racism and white supremacy in America. His mission it to help people from all walks of life bring an anti-racism approach into classrooms, curriculum, churches, non-profits, other institutions they serve, and in their daily lives.

Jack's articles and talks on race, education, religion and diversity have appeared in The Baltimore Sun, Black Issues Book Review, NPR, ABC, Chicago Tribune, The Afro American Newspaper, Washington Post.com, Urbanite Magazine, The Chicago Defender and other outlets. He is also a contributor to the books, A Guide for White Women Who Teach Black Boys (Corwin Press) and Diversity Work in Independent Schools: The Practice and The Practitioner, a publication of the National Association of Independent Schools.

Jack holds degrees from Frostburg State University, Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, MD, and Middlebury College in Middlebury, VT. A Baltimore native, Jack, his wife, and their three children reside in Cambridge, MA.
