Good Morning Huskie Families,

As I always do with two weeks left in the semester, I reflect on how we are doing so far this year. My most important measurement is the overall level of happiness and engagement I see in the building; students gathering, laughing and engaging in conversations with each other instead of quiet existence in their cellphones, increased participation in extracurricular activities and events, and an overall well-being of our students through the data collected in classrooms, student services and anecdotally. Overall, we are indeed recovering from the impact of the last few years. It makes me hopeful as we move forward that we are headed in the right direction, doing the right things. We still have some work to do though, as a school and community partnership for our student body. Our attendance rates are much more positive than last year, but our first hour tardies are extremely high. (compare 7,000+ for the first period to under 300 for every other period). We will continue to help students manage their time and resources to arrive on time to their first period class; this includes allowing the appropriate amount of time to arrive at school in the morning, which includes navigating the difficulty of 3000 people all coming to the same place at the same time each day, managing the social time allotted before school starts, and the importance of the beginning of each class period is to our student success. To learn effectively, students need to be in person, in class with our teachers.

Thankfully, most of our students will never experience a conflict with a peer that requires adult intervention and can't be resolved independently. However, for those that do, we have a multitude of staff, services and resources available to support intervention and mediation of those situations. Naperville North will never be a place where it is acceptable to address conflict through verbal or physical altercations. As a school, when we know of a conflict, and can partner with families proactively, we can apply the appropriate measures to resolve and grow from these situations.

Reminders:

- If you are dropping off your student in the bus lot in the morning, please keep safety in mind. This
 lot can be used for drop-offs AFTER 7:15 AM. If buses are present, please DO NOT drive around
 the buses when they are unloading students. You will need to wait and then pull forward when it
 is safe to do so.
- Early dismissal of students we are experiencing large numbers of parents walking in and asking for their students to be dismissed. Please be mindful that we need an hour's notice to make this happen. Please call the attendance line or go online to report the early dismissal. Overall, I see a student body that is growing academically and social emotionally by leaps and bounds. I see an engaged community, all striving to support each other and Naperville North through quality



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instruction, meaningful experiences, and an inclusive environment. I'm truly proud to be surrounded by students and families who care about and are involved in their educational experiences, and a staff that supports growth and development through challenging and supportive environments. Thanks to each of you for being a part of this success, now and in 2023.

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Seal of Biliteracy Exam: AAPPL (ACTFL Assessment of Performance toward Proficiency in Languages) exam registration for the Seal of Biliteracy is now open for seniors! Students who attended the Seal of Biliteracy informational meeting in September received an email with the link to the Google form to register for the AAPPL exam. Registration closes on December 22, and the cost of the exam is \$30. Students eligible for free or reduced lunch do not need to pay the fee.

The AAPPL exam is offered in Arabic, Mandarin Chinese, French, German, Korean, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish, Italian, and Japanese. The AAPPL exam is offered only to seniors and will be given at NNHS on February 4 at 8:00 am. Juniors who may have special circumstances, such as a desire to test in more than one language, should contact Mrs. Dinon at LDinon@naperville203.org to inquire about testing during junior year.
