made crafts to re questions and ha




understanding, kindness, peace and MLK. It was amazing!










First grade students made collaborative murals that are prominently displayed in the First Grade hallway. Look at that artistry and teamwork from the entire first grade. What impressive pieces!





Grade 4



School Nurse Notes



ORAL HEALTH MATTERS!

- Among children aged 6-8 years, over half (52%) have had a **cavity** in their **primary** (baby) teeth.
- Among adolescents aged 12-19, more than half (57%) have had a cavity in their **permanent** teeth.
- Tooth decay is the number one chronic infectious disease among children in the U.S. See helpful tips <u>HERE</u>.

Tips

Brush **twice a day** with fluoride toothpaste. Wondering about fluoride? Here are some **FAQs**. (watch kids brush who are younger than 6: use a pea-sized amount of toothpaste and have them spit it out).

Help your child brush until they have good skills.

Regular dental checks help to:

Teach children the **value** of good oral health. Help **find** oral health problems early so tooth decay can be **managed** or stopped.

For younger children, have a routine with your child: BRUSH, BOOK, BED

- 1. Each night, help your children **BRUSH** their teeth.
- 2. Read a favorite BOOK (or two)!
- 3. Get to **BED** at a regular time each night.

Does your child have a dental home?

If not, please reach out to your school nurse to help get connected.
