What is the Day of Silence and Why be Silent?

From the GLSEN site: "The GLSEN Day of Silence is a student-led national event that brings attention to anti-LGBTQ name-calling, bullying and harassment in schools. Students from middle school to college take a vow of silence in an effort to encourage schools and classmates to address the problem of anti-LGBTQ behavior by illustrating the silencing effect of bullying and harassment on LGBTQ students and those perceived to be LGBTQ."

Youth Risk Behavior Survey

Belmont will once again participate in the Youth Risk Behavior Survey. This survey has been administered to Belmont youth biannually since 2019 as part of the Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System (YRBSS) developed and maintained by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC). The survey is used to monitor health behaviors, some of which are high risk, among the adolescent population in the Belmont Public Schools. The collected data helps identify areas of need, so that the schools - and affiliated partners like the Belmont Wellness Coalition - can plan programming to address those needs.

On Monday, April 3, I sent an email to the parents/guardians of all students in grades 7 and 8 to provide more information about this survey and how to opt out. The deadline to opt out is April 14.

Community Block

We previously shared how Community Block presents the ability for staff to have meaningful conversations in smaller groups. Below you will find a schedule for Community Blocks for the remainder of the year. As you may recall, our Social Emotional Committee and school based Equity Team do try to provide lessons for educators to use during this time. However, the majority of Community Block lessons are teacher generated lessons where teachers and students can continue to build and maintain meaningful relationships that allow us to have impactful conversations.

Teacher generated lessons are not lessons or activities focusing on social justice topics. Some examples of what those lessons look like are below. In all grades 5-8 students have played games such as charades, categories, and other fun activities.

SAFETY REQUEST: RING THE BELL AT THE FRONT DOOR TO ENTER THE BUILDING

An important safety protocol at Chenery is that every adult that wants to enter our building is buzzed in by our front office via the Washington Street Entrance. Please do not ask teachers, students, or exiting visitors to hold the door so you can enter. We have a clear protocol to receive visitors and expect everyone to follow this protocol. We appreciate your help with this important matter.

STUDENT MATERIALS DROP OFF AREA

At times parents/guardians will come to school to give their students materials that are needed for the school day. Please be mindful that parents/guardians may enter via the Washington Street entrance, find the bookshelf at the door, and log the student's materials on the clipboard. At the end of every block students are called down to the main office for their materials. This procedure is least disruptive to student learning and we work to be timely with students retrieving their items.

You do not need to go to the main office to let staff know you have dropped off an item.



Executive Functioning Tips for Home

Sometimes students who struggle with mental health may also struggle with motivation and task initiation. A good way to combat this is to hang up visual reminders around the house on a notebook, or near a desk.

Mnemonics can be a visual representation for students. The CHECK strategy is a way to help students get started studying.

Change environments. Have all equipment nearby. Establish rewards for yourself. Create a checklist of tasks to be done. Keep a worry pad.

For the "C", change environments, make sure to reflect on whether or not the place you do your homework is effective for you, if not find the right environment. Consider lighting, sound level, and distractions when considering the place. If it interferes, change it, if you get distracted find a quieter place. For the "H", have all equipment nearby when studying, and make sure to collect the right items. For the "E" establish rewards for yourself, as an example, eat a favorite food after completion, or play your favorite video game. For the second "C" create a checklist of tasks to be done, this can be super rewarding, checking off things that have been completed. For the "K" keep a worry pad, if you get distracted keep this pad to write down all the thoughts popping into your head.

School Hours/Arrival and Departure Procedures

- ★ School hours are 7:45AM-2:25PM
- ★ Students may arrive as early as 7:30AM
 - Please note that we do not have staff assigned to duties before this time, therefore students are not allowed to enter the building until then.
- ★ Upon arrival
 - Grade 5 enters the cafeteria
 - Grade 6 enters the auditorium
 - Grade 7 waits on the plaza (by playground)
 - Grade 8 waits on the plaza (near parking lot)
- ★ Upon departure
 - \circ $\;$ Bus students depart to the parking lot where buses are waiting
 - Walkers and bikers independently leave
 - Car pick-up students go to Washington Street

It would be helpful for incoming fifth grade families, and new students to Chenery, to practice their pick up meeting spot and routines for the end of the day.


