I am wrt ng to set the record straight on an FAQ updated recently by TASB Legal Services on Legal Issues Related to Transgender Students.

Yesterday, a group of n ne Texas representatives sent a letter to a school board presidents that grossly misrepresents the content of the legal FAQ, as we last an inaccurate time neighbor on the leave the National School Boards Association.

It's important that you understand the facts, especially since this same group of awmakers is unfortunately using both misinformation and disinformation to call on Texas school boards to leave TASB.

Frst of a, TASB d d not just release "egal guidance or guide nes" related to transgender policies in schools as claimed. Rather, we updated a legal FAQ, which is not albed nective for school districts and simply out nes Texas laws and national court decisions that might weigh into local district decisions on this issue. This legal FAQ had been on neighborhood as updated in learly January to reflect a case out of the Eleventh Circuit in December.

More importantly, this FAQ does not encourage school districts to refrain from reporting child abuse and to obscure information from parents.

In fact, the FAQ does the fo owng:

- It encourages d str ct off c a s to seek ega adv ce.
- It encourages d str cts to work c ose y w th parents and students to f nd nd v dua zed, reasonable so ut ons that protect students safety, privacy, and we being in the educational environment.
- It c tes the Texas Attorney Genera s gu dance about parenta r ghts tw ce n the document.
- It c tes and repeats the aw on report ng ch d abuse verbat m, c ear y not ng that "a person hav ng reasonab e cause to be eve that a ch d's phys ca or menta hea th or we fare has been adverse y affected by abuse or neg ect by any person must mmed ate y make a report as prov ded by Texas Fam y Code chapter 261."
- F na y, the FAQ s fu y a gned w th Texas UIL ru es and the "Save Grs Sports Act." TASBs ega framework at the re evant po cy c ear y says that a student must part c pate n an interscho ast c ath et c compet t on that s designated for the boog callest stated on the students birth certificate.

Those are the facts. Unfortunate y, this etter does nothing to advance understanding of what we alknow is a legal y complex and evolving area of awand policy. For nearly 75 years, TASB has been committed to providing resources and services to school boards with the goal of strengthening public education. Sadly, there are some who are trying to weaken our schools and our communities with intentional misrepresentations. Divisive, Washington-style politics has no place in Texas public schools. As your executive director, I will a ways correct and clarify false information so that you have all the facts.

F na y, I want to point out that TASB did not take nearly a year to leave the National School Boards Association following its Sept. 29 etter to the Biden administration. Our Board of Directors made the decision in May following their elease of an independent investigation that disclosed new details about the development of that letter. Again, facts matter, and I micrommitted to a ways prioritizing accuracy and transparency so that TASB can continue to serve our members with excellence and integrity.
