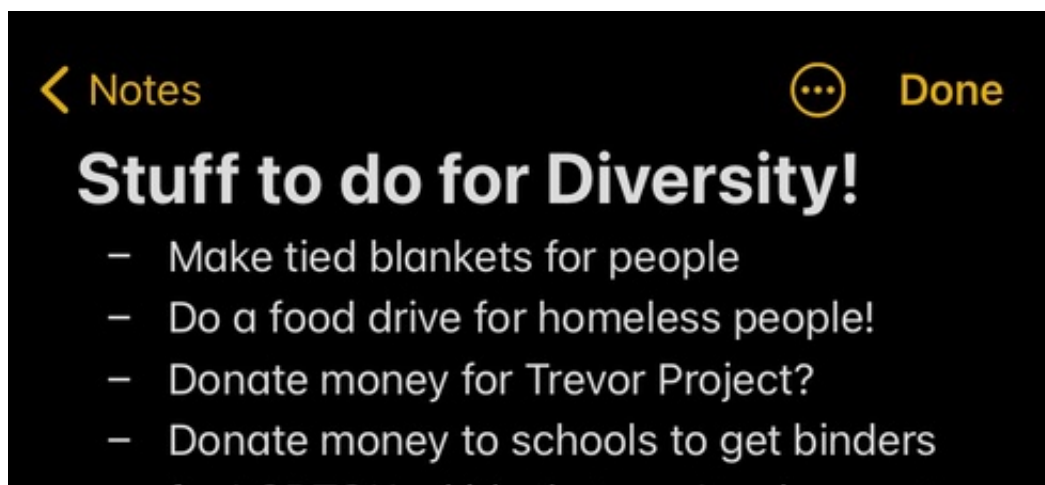
Let me know if you have any questions. Here are the texts from the kids: (some of them are great ideas)
