

SCHEDULING A MEETING














There are several ways students can request to meet with their counselor:

- Scan your counselor's QR code
 - They can be found in teacher classrooms, outside of the counseling office, bulletin boards, water fountains, and in the library
- If unable to scan a QR code, fill out a paper request in the counseling office
- Send your counselor an email
- Stop by to see if we are available!
- IN AN EMERGENCY, students should NOT leave the counseling office!
 - Emergencies are... situations that are potentially harmful to overall health of you or other person (hurting self, someone else hurting you, intent to hurt someone else)
 - Schedule changes, college questions, transcript requests are not emergencies

IMPORTANCE OF REGISTRATION

- The FMHS Master Schedule is built from student course selections made in the spring.
- **Teachers are hired** and **course sections are created** based upon student selections in the spring. (Food Science example)
- The accuracy of student selections is an integral part of this process.
- Please choose your courses and alternates wisely.
- FMHS has designed a course selection process to give students ample time to make accurate choices based on their skill levels, teacher input and course pathways. Counselors meet individually with each student during registration to help with selections. Students and parents will confirm course requests during the course verification process in May.
- We kindly ask for respect regarding limited schedule changes.

AP/HONORS COMMITMENT

If you are planning to take Honors and/or AP courses, please reading the following:

- AP courses are taught at a college level.
- I understand the Honors or AP class requires work at a higher level and understand the extra time required to complete advanced material at an advanced pace.
- Placement in Honors or AP is a commitment. I understand this class may not be appropriate for all students.
- 4) I am committed to the advanced level program. I understand I will not be allowed to level down from an AP or Honors course for at least 3 weeks**, at which time I may request a schedule change if my grade is below a 75.
- 5) I have reviewed and discussed with my parent/guardian the attached sheet entitled, "Are you ready for Honors or AP?"

SCHEDULING TIMELINE


PRIOR TO SCHOOL BEGINNING: Students may move from Honors or AP to on-level before the first day of class. Once a student begins the Honors or AP course, he/she must stay in the course for 3 weeks. Students may then request a level change at the 3 week mark.

PRIOR TO THE FIRST DAY AND FIRST 3 DAYS: Students may level up prior to the first day and during the first 3 days of class. For example: change from Algebra 2 to Algebra 2 Honors.

FIRST 5 DAYS: Seniors wishing to drop a class for Senior In or Senior Out after the start of school may do so ONLY if they are dropping a 1_{st} or 4_{th} period course. Be sure to check the total number of credits. Do not rearrange classes for this change to be made.

AP courses with no level change option can be changed within the first 5 days. (For example: AP Calculus AB, AP Calculus BC, AP Environmental Science). If a student is in an Honors or AP course and has already completed the lower level course, he/she can drop the upper level course within the first 5 days.

Program changes are allowed to/from Athletics, Performing Arts, JROTC, etc.

Schedule change requests made prior to school starting, must meet at least one of the following criteria:

- Failure to meet course prerequisites
- Failure to meet graduation requirements
- Course changes due to completion of summer school
- Inappropriate level placement (level down or level up)
- Students earning a failing grade from the previous year
- Error in the schedule: repeat class, two classes in the same period, sequencing problems, balance cores, not enough classes, etc.
- Program Changes for example: Band, Choir, Athletics, etc.
- Dropping an elective for an Honors or AP course (only if there is room in the course)
- Please note that certain schedule changes are not available - for example:
 - Elective for an elective change
 - VLA to an in-person class change
