Subject: Re: Facing History following up

Hi Anna,

Well, it's been a very difficult few days since we spoke, obviously. I hope you are doing alright in light of the news from Israel, and if anything it reinforces the importance of the initiatives you were speaking about, in terms of confronting antisemitism in Newton.

So, I wanted to follow up as promised with some information I got back from my finance colleagues, even though I don't have a nicely formatted proposal to send you yet.

For training your middle and high school humanities teachers in Contemporary Antisemitism, it will be a range of \$30,000-\$40,000 for one full day in person with about 100 participants - so the (I believe it was) \$34,000 I estimated on Friday was on target. There is a baseline minimum cost of \$300 per person (plus travel and curriculum fees) for a full day in person. Therefore, that full day cost would go up or down if you had, say, more like 75 (starting at \$22,500) or 125 people (starting at \$37,500). It could be broken up into two half days for that same cost of the full day equivalent.

We also discussed Holocaust and Human Behavior as well, and I can share details of that district curriculum partnership package in a subsequent conversation - that package is actually being updated at this very moment. We do those for up to 5 years, and it includes not only training in HHB and follow up coaching support, but also teacher and student-facing materials.

I hope this helps for your most immediate need for information, but I look forward to staying in touch as the conversation unfolds. Of course please let me know if you have any questions.

Thank you very much for reaching out to us, and I apologize for the delay in responding. I just learned about your inquiry, which was mistakenly routed to a colleague who has been away this past week on a learning trip to Germany and Poland.

I would of course be happy to discuss possibilities with you for how Facing History can support your work in Newton. I am assuming this would be planning for next year?

We have a wide range of options and pricing models depending on the depth and breadth of an engagement you might be seeking - factors include the number of people, length of time/number of sessions, and in person or virtual. With a bit more detailed understanding of the general scope you have in mind, I should be able to provide you with some ballpark budget numbers, knowing that any contract is negotiated with the particulars of a district's needs in mind.

I apologize again for not being able to get back to you sooner, but I hope we can connect. You can also just email me back a rough sense of what you're looking for (to the factors mentioned above) and I could send you back some general ideas about cost, for the purpose of your initial funder meetings next week. If tomorrow afternoon doesn't work but you want to connect by phone, I can also talk on Tuesday morning.
