



WHAT IS STUDENT ACTIVISM?

Work by students to cause political, environmental, economic, or social change. A protected First Amendment Right.





STUDENTS ARE HURTING

Students are constantly exposed to the daily atrocities that are egregious in Palestine and may have personal connection via family, history, and shared culture, or a humanitarian connection. They feel helpless and want an avenue to channel their outrage in a productive way to create change in governments, institutions, and media.

We, as educators, are responsible for allowing and teaching students how to use their rights effectively.

ARE PROTESTS INHERENTLY DISRUPTIVE?

Without a doubt! In fact, their effectiveness as protests hinges on this very disruption. By affording students a secure space to express their dissent, we not only empower them but also ensure their protection.

WILL THEIR ACTIVISM MAKE SOME PEOPLE FEEL UNCOMFORTABLE?

Absolutely! Challenging authority, governments and the public to take action inevitably make people uncomfortable. Yet, it is our job to facilitate a safe environment for our students to do so.

- Teach-ins
- Walk-outs
- Day of solidarity (Wearing certain apparel)
- Hanging Signage/Posters
- Conducting petitions and surveys
- Boycotts
- Protests/Rallies



HOW TO SUPPORT?

Have an open mind. Do not try to diminish their cause or come in with preconceived notions about what they are standing for.

CREATE A SAFE SPACE FOR ACTIVISM.

- Create a healthy space for discourse.
- Allow students to wear apparel to show their solidarity.
- Guide and Support: Invite students to discuss any potential activism work they wish to enact with you.
- Teach students their First Amendment Rights and how to be safe during any form of protest.


