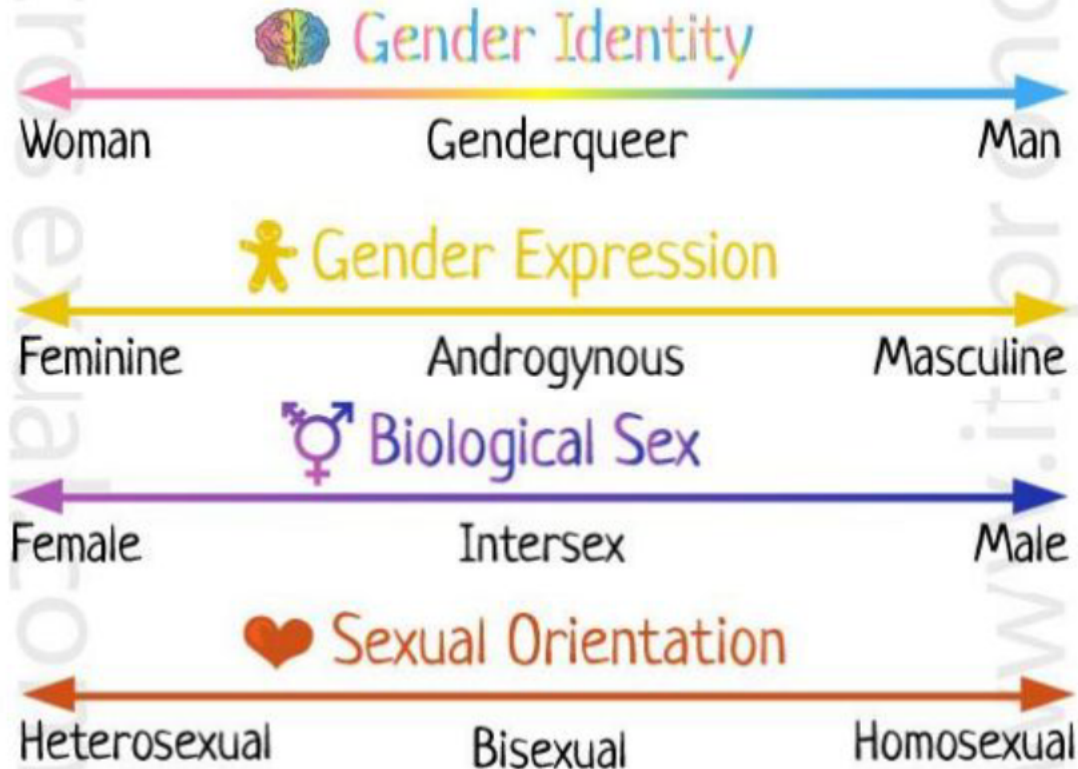


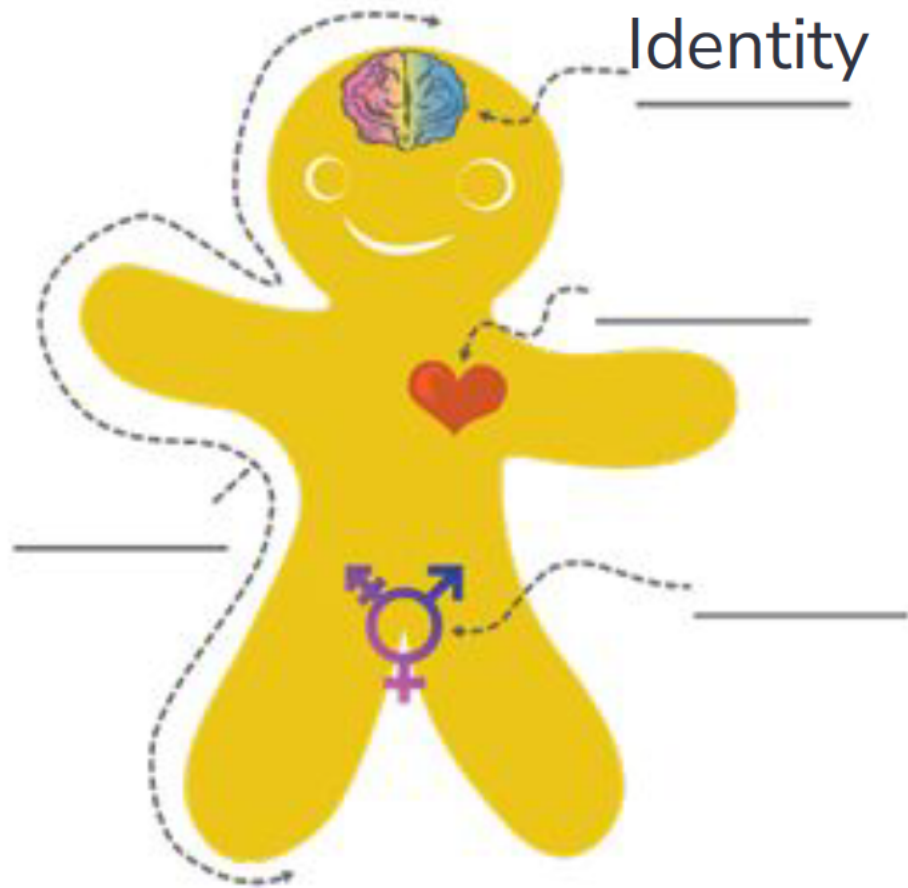

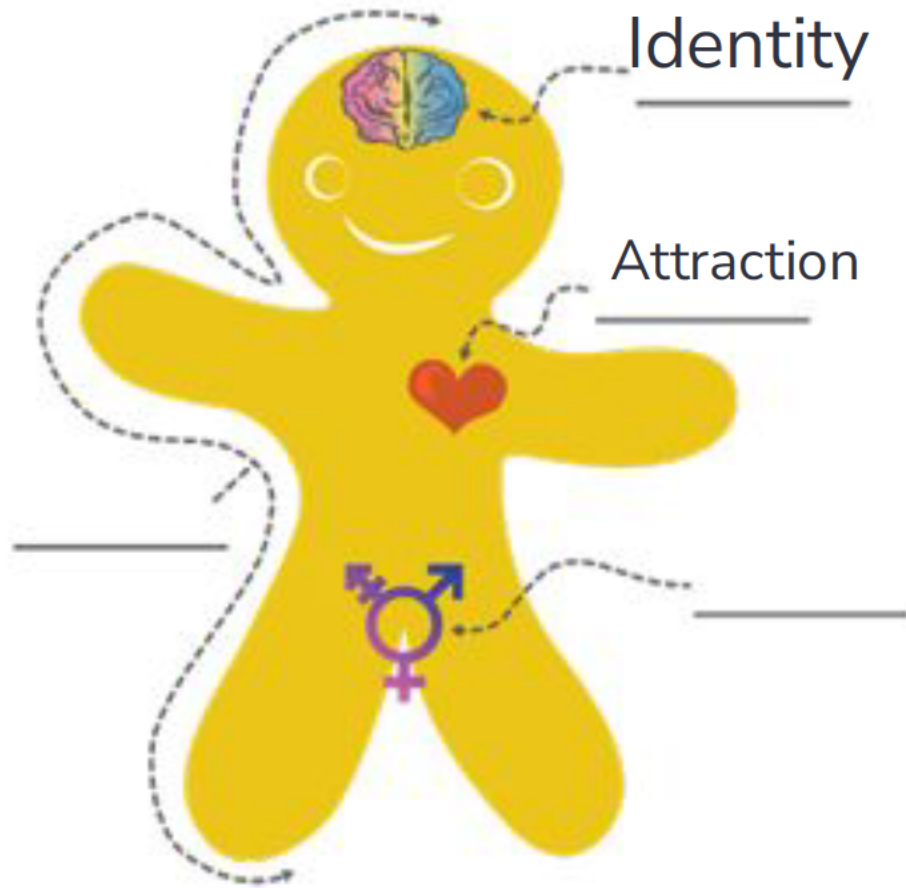

Our sense of being male, female, or some combination of the two (p. 481)





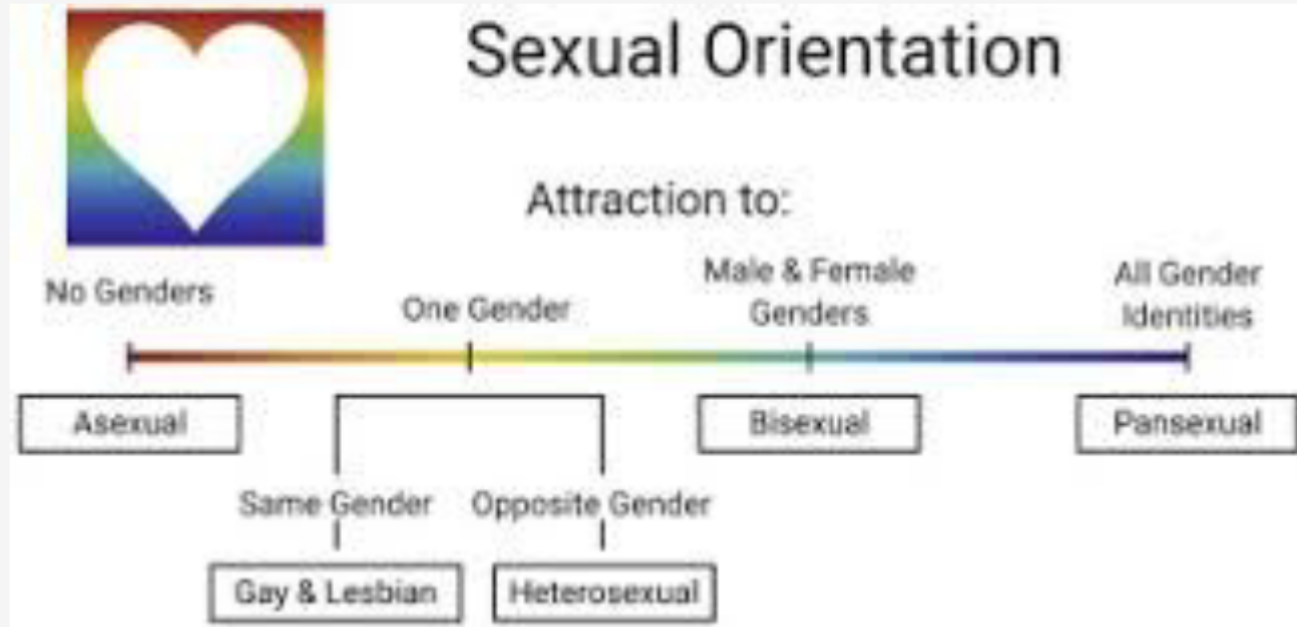

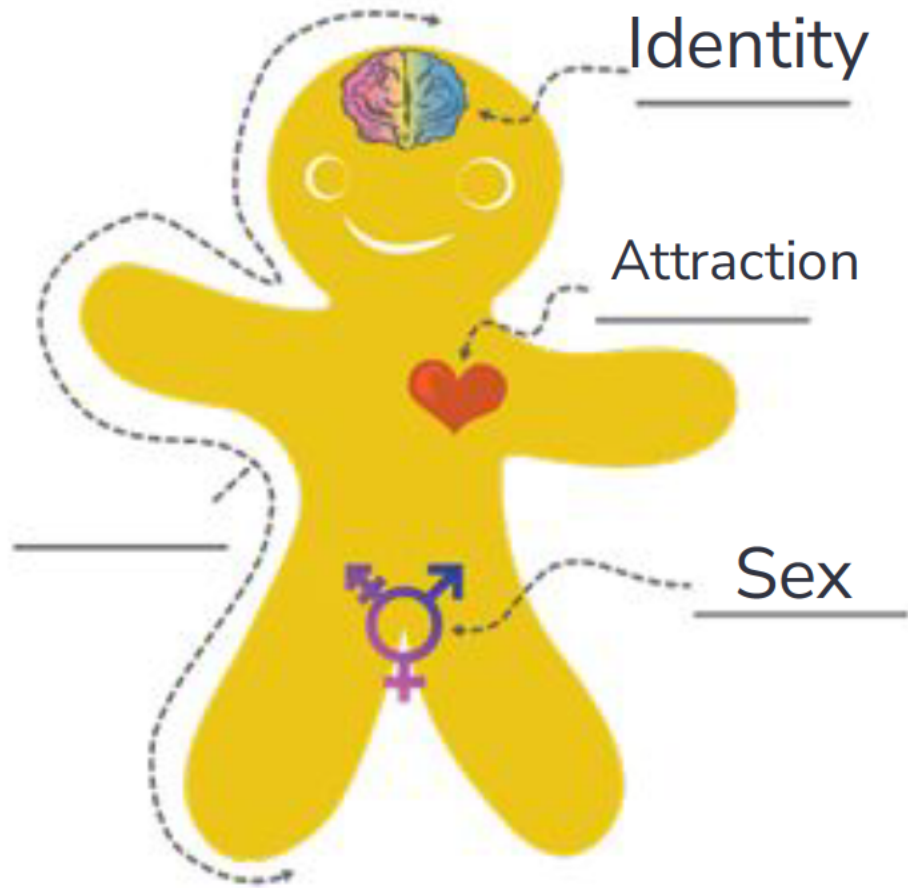
Attraction

Our enduring sexual attraction, usually toward members of our own sex (homosexual) or the other sex (heterosexual); variations exist (p. 505)





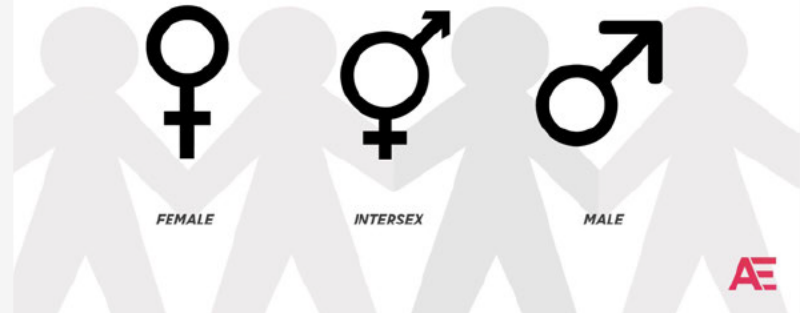


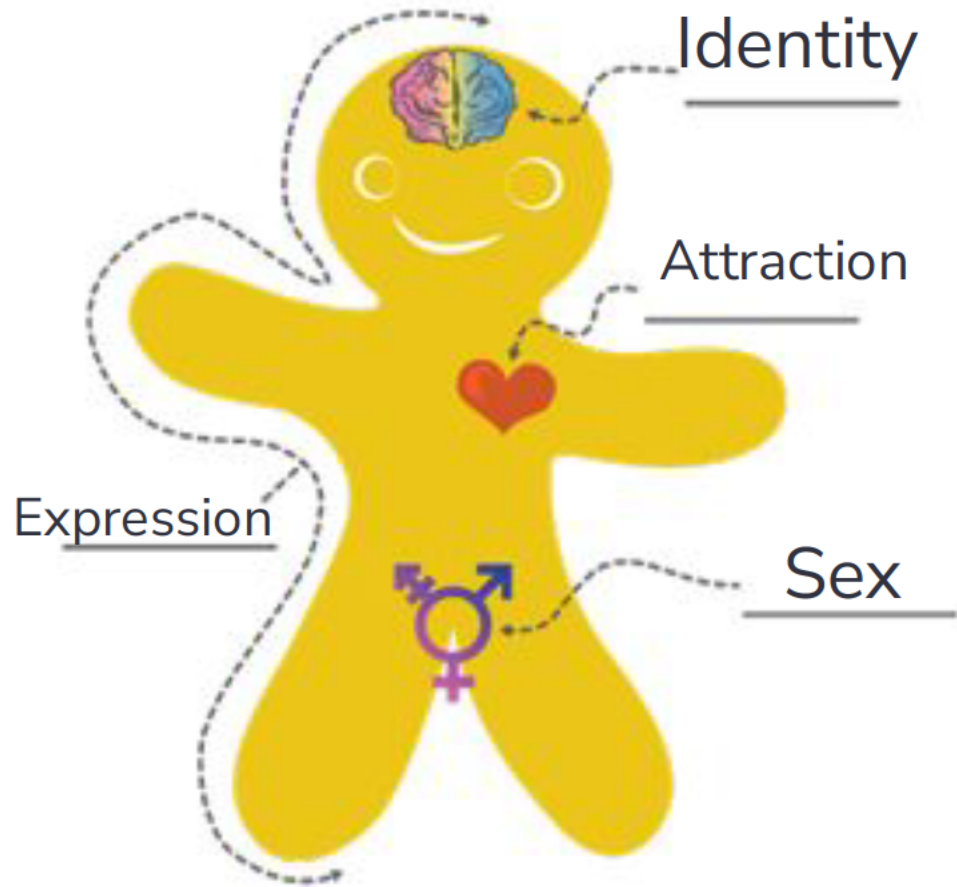
In psychology, the biologically influenced characteristics by which people define “male” and “female” (p. 476)

What is Assigned Sex at Birth?

Assigned Sex at Birth is the sex that doctors assign to an infant after checking his/her genitals. Attributes such as chromosomes present, internal and external genital and reproductive anatomy, as well as hormones influence the doctors' assignment.

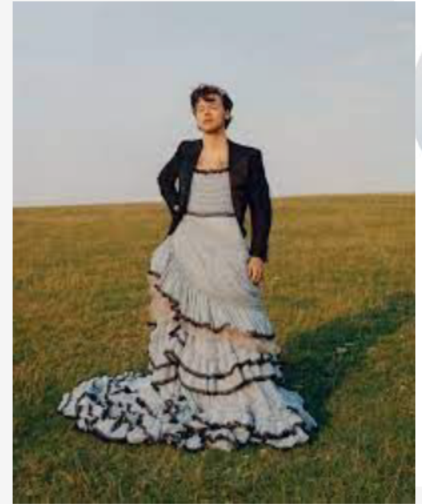






Gender Expression

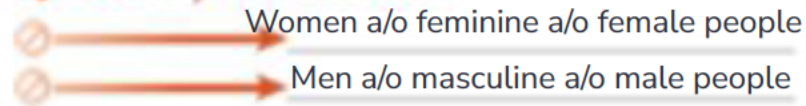

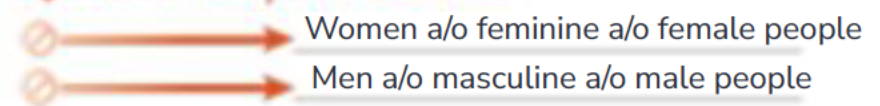
