EQUALITY


The state of being equal, especially in status, rights, and opportunities

→ PRIVILEGE


A special right, advantage, or immunity granted or available only to a particular person or group.



Life Lesson Take Two Steps Forward Race A Very Powerful Message

□ PREJUDICE

Judging someone without knowing them, on the basis of what they look like or what group they belong to. For example: All black people are good dancers.

STEREOTYPE

Thinking all people who belong to a certain group are the same and labeling them. For example: All young people who wear hoodies are thugs.

□ IMPLICIT BIAS

Prejudice in favor of or against one thing, person, or group compared with another, usually in a way considered to be unfair.


MARGINALIZATION

Treatment of a person or group of people as insignificant.



□ DEHUMANIZATION

To treat a person less than human, to make someone feel like they are less than human.

When laws, processes and protocols discriminate people because of their race.



Systemic Racism Explained

○ PROTEST vs RIOT

A PROTEST is an event in which people gather to show disapproval of something.

A RIOT is violent and uncontrolled public behavior by a group of people



Differences between protests and riots

○ POLICE BRUTALITY

Is when police officers exercise undue or excessive force against a subject. This includes, but is not limited to, physical or verbal harassment, physical or mental injury, property damage, and death.

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




