





Equity recognizes that each person has different circumstances and allocates the exact resources and opportunities needed to reach an equal outcome.






Inclusion





Implicit Bias

- Can be positive or negative
- Based on stereotypes
- Can lead to assuming and being dismissive
- Are pervasive everyone has them
- Formed over a lifetime
- Are changeable over time with intention and training
- Is "fundamental to the way we process the world"

Impact of Implicit Bias on Students


Gender and Math

- » Math teachers were more likely to believe math is harder for white girls compared to white boys (Tiedemann, 2002; Riegle-Crumb & Humphries, 2012)
- » Math teacher stereotypes correlated to female students attending easier high school (Carlana, 2019)
- » Bigger differences in math scores between white boys and girls existed when students were assigned to teachers with strong gender bias (Carlana, 2019)
 - Girls underperformed
 - Girls self-selected into less rigorous high schools
 - Girls experiences lower self-esteem related into math alatty

Impact of Implicit Bias on Students (Cont.)

Behavior

» Black male children identified as needing more attention due to "challenging behaviors" 1



- » Teachers were more likely to respond w/second infraction for black students compared to White students 2
- » Black and hispanic students receive more severe consequences that white students 3
- » Students with disability status more likely to receive harsher consequences when compared to students without a disability 3

mpact of Implicit Bias on Students (Cont.)

LGBTQ+ Students

- » LGBTQ+ students felt unsafe at school related to their sexual orientation (59.1%) and gender expression (42.5%)
- » 75.6% of students heard derogatory remarks ("fag"; "dyke"; "that's so gay")
 - ♦ 35.7% reported school staff present when remarks were made
 - ♦ 46.6% reported that staff did not intervene
- » 52.4% of students reported hearing teachers/staff make homophobic remarks
- » 66.7% of students reported hearing teachers/staff make negative comments about gender expression of student(s)
