
UNDERSTANDING DISCRIMINATION BASED ON SEXUAL ORIENTATION & GENDER IDENTITY

TITLE IX

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DISCRIMINATION BASED ON SEXUAL ORIENTATION AND GENDER IDENTITY

THE LAW

Prohibits discrimination based on sex in education programs and activities.

EXAMPLES OF

DISCRIMINATION

- Sexually suggestive remarks or jokes
- Displaying or distributing sexually suggestive pictures or mesages
 (e.g., drawings, photos, videos)
- Sexually suggestive gesturing (hand gestures, grabbing oneself)
- Teasing or name-calling related to sexual characteristics or beliefs or perception that are not conforming to expected gender roles or conduct.


