Goals	

Background & Return on Investment:

The Department of Student and Family Engagement requests authorization to enter into a purchase of service agreement with the International Institute for Restorative Practices.

During the 2016-2017 school year, the district engaged in a series of conversations related to alternatives to suspensions and school climate. A committee was formed to review data and bring forth recommendations for alternatives to suspension frameworks. Trauma-informed practices and restorative justices practices were selected. Principals were then instructed to determine which framework they would like to utilize moving forward in their buildings. Buildings provided feedback to the Department of Student and Family Engagement. Research began to determine how to move forward with a comprehensive training that also allowed a menu of offerings that buildings could build upon.

A building's choice to implement restorative practices directly aligns with the district expectation of an effective Positive Behavior Intervention Supports (PBIS) model.

The International Institute for Restorative Practices (IIRP) is the world's leading provider of restorative practices professional development and educational resources. The IIRP is noted to work closely with school districts providing a proactive whole-school approach that addresses school climate and restoring and developing social capital, social discipline, emotional well-being, and civic participation.

The professional development will allow staff from the designated buildings to attend a two-day training during the summer professional development academy in June. Schools will have the opportunity to send up to 4 staff members to the training. The training topics will include Introduction to Restorative Practices and Using Circles Effectively. The training manuals are also provided for the sessions. In addition IIRP will also provide an advanced three-day train the trainer for 36 staff, which will consist of social workers, counselors, school psychologists, and safety and security. Upon completion of this training, participants will be licensed trainers in order to train other staff and departments in the district on the Introduction to Restorative Practices, Using Circles Effectively, Facilitating Restorative Conferences and family Engagement and Empowerment. This will allow us to continue to build internal capacity and train district-wide.

Background & Return on Investment:

The Department of Student Support Services, Division of Social-Emotional and Student Support Services requests authorization to enter into a purchase of service agreement with the Internal Institute for Restorative Practices (IIRP).

During the 2017-2018, the district approved IIRP to provide (2) 2-day trainings for staff during the Re-Imagine Me Conference and 3 cohort groups of Train the Trainers. We now have 36 IIRP certified trainers in Restorative Practices in our district. As a result, our trainers have trained staff and departments on Restorative Practices during the 2018-2019 school year. Year to date, we have 61 schools identified as interested in RP training; 26 have been trained. The purchase of this service will allow (4) 2 -day training sessions in the 2019 Re-Imagine Me Conference and 1 cohort of Train the Trainer (13 people) to be trained. This will continue to deepen our work in moving toward a Restorative Practice district and provide training to the remaining buildings who have identified RP as their framework. This new cohort of trainers will join the current 36 trainers to allow the district to strengthen its training resources and train in a manner that aligns our other district initiatives of Positive Behavior Support Interventions (PBIS), Trauma-Informed practices, and social-emotional learning standards.

Train the Trainer Model: Fundamentals of Restorative Practices (Onsite) Onsite 3-day training/ 6.5 hours each day for a max of 50 staff with 5 instructors.

In Alignment with Board Guardrail 2.1, CCS Staff will receive training on becoming Restorative Practices Trainers. With this training, they will train all staff in adopting a Restorative Practices approach to student management, resulting in increased time in class with students who are more able to self-regulate and staff who are more able to guide them in regulating. our student information system: increased attendance as a result of more welcoming and restorative school environments, decreased chronic absenteeism, decreased exclusions.

The Office of Social - Emotional and Student Support Services requests authorization to enter into a purchase agreement with the International Institute for Restorative Practices.

During the 2016-2017 school year, the district engaged in a series of conversations related to alternatives to suspensions and school climate. A committee was formed with the expectation to bring forth recommendations for alternative to suspension frameworks. In 2017, the discipline committee brought forth recommendations related to alternatives to suspensions. Restorative Practices was identified as one of the frameworks.

The International Institute for Restorative Practices (IIRP) is the world's leading provider of restorative practices professional development and educational resources. IIRP is noted to work closely with school districts providing a proactive whole school approach that addresses school climate and restoring and developing social capital, social discipline, emotional well-being and civic participation. Restorative Practices directly aligns with the district expectation of an effective Positive Behavior Intervention Supports (PBIS) model and the districts strategic priority related to culture and climate. Under this strategic priority we are focused on creating welcoming environments with an emphasis on student well-being through the use of PBIS, restorative practices and trauma-informed care.

In the spring of 2019, eight schools: West HS;Briggs HS;Westmoor MS, Wedgewood MS; Hilltonia MS; Walnut Ridge HS; Columbus North International, and Marion-Franklin HS applied for and were awarded a district School Quality Improvement Grant (SQIG) through The Ohio Department Education under the category of school climate and culture. The purpose of the grant is to develop frameworks and an infrastructure to increase and support positive climate and culture in buildings. This support will lead to increased attendance, engagement and academic success of students. As a part of the grant structure and plan, training through the International Institute for Restorative Practices was identified to provide professional development in restorative practices for all eight buildings occurring in the 2019-2020 school year.

The eight buildings will participate collectively in the two-day training occurring in October and November which will include introduction to restorative practices and restorative circles in schools. In conjunction with site base coordinators and social emotional support specialist who were also hired under the grant these buildings will be able to have common language and understating of restorative practices and the internal supports in place to coach staff and develop an infrastructure to sustain the framework. This work will allow staff and students to improve relationships, build community and address harm as it occurs with utilizing corrective measures that restore relationships and build school community.
