All students will learn in an equitable, culturally responsive, physically, and emotionally healthy and safe environment.


Family & Community Engagement

Students with Disabilities, students in Foster Care, and students who identify as Black/African American will benefit from targeted programs and services that leverage their assets, affirm their identities, and address their needs to close achievement, opportunity, and relationship gaps.





Educational Equity

Educational equity is defined as both a **process** and an **outcome** (Putnam-Walkerly & Russell, 2016):

- The **process** of using a lens of equity to analyze and inform decisions, policies, and practices in our schools and district to ensure they are culturally sensitive and provide all students with access, opportunity, validation, support, and resources.
- The **outcome** whereby all educational outcomes are no longer predicted by identity categories such as race, ethnicity, ability, gender, and socioeconomic status.

Young Men Rising Programs (served 51 students to date this school year)

- Samuel Jackman Middle School (began mid 2021-2022)
- Pleasant Grove High School (began January 2023)
- Valley High School (began March 2023)
- Meetings take place at lunchtime/advocacy

Improve Your Tomorrow (served 695 students to date this school year)

- 9 high schools/middle schools
- Supports during and after school

Inaugural Young Men of Color Empowerment Conference (March 4, 2023)

Student and Family Empowerment Centers - Student Centered Support/School, Family and Community Relationships



The SAFE Office team provides direct services for students and families that are facing challenges due to economic hardships and homelessness. Staffing includes:

- Program Specialist/Homeless Liaison
- Two School Social Workers
- Six Regional Team Program Technicians
- Two Program Assistants
- One Academic Intervention Teacher
- Two Project Implementers
- Two Family Advocates
- School Counselor (part-time)
