


College Academy vs. State Outcomes for YMoC 2016-2022

A-G Completion Rate



IYT Draft



Student Draft Criteria

- 50 9th/10th grade young men of color (YMOC) including; African American or Black, Hispanic or Latino, Southeast Asian, Native American, Pacific Islander or Native Hawaiian.
- Target GPA range includes: 50% below a
 2.0; 30% between 2.0-2.75; 20% above a
 2.75
- 50% of the students should have issues with attendance or classroom behavior


IYT Draft - Timeline


