




A nation in which young men of color are overrepresented in higher education, underrepresented in the criminal justice system, and are leaders in their community.

- Mentors earn bi-weekly stipend, loan deferment options, and up to a \$10K educational award







Our Approach to Mentorship



Mentorship sessions touch on three major areas and utilize an OARS (open questions, affirmations, reflective listening, Summary Reflections) approach to relationship building.






College Academy Expense Breakdown






Bay Area College Academy Funding Breakdown






Central Valley College Academy Funding Breakdown






Sacramento Region College Academy Funding Breakdown






Students Entering the Program

IYT Draft



Student Draft Criteria

- 50 9th/10th grade young men of color (YMOC) including; African American or Black, Hispanic or Latino, Southeast Asian, Native American, Pacific Islander or Native Hawaiian.
- Target GPA range includes: 50% below a 2.0; 30% between 2.0-2.75; 20% above a 2.75
- 50% of the students should have issues with attendance or classroom behavior




