Approval of the contract amendment between Washington Unified School District and Project Sankofa for the 2024-2025 School Year.

Project Sankofa's Black Young Women's Collective is a small group program for **black girls** in high school and aims to provide a supportive and empowering space for participants to explore their identities, address unique challenges, and develop valuable skills for personal and academic success for a maximum of 30 students. The program will consist of regular sessions held in a safe and inclusive environment, where participants can engage in discussions, activities, and receive mentorship from trusted facilitators.

To measure the impact of this program, participants' self-confidence and self-esteem levels will be assessed before and after the program using self-report measures or validated scales. Additionally, staff will monitor improvements in participants' belief in their abilities and their willingness to pursue personal and academic goals. Feedback on participants' ability to navigate challenges related to their identity and their level of comfort in expressing themselves authentically will also be collected. Participants' engagement with mentors and facilitators will also be measured to ensure high quality mentorship. Participants' academic engagement will also be measured using grades, attendance, or completion of challenging assignments.

The Family Engagement Program seeks to create a supportive community for African Diaspora families with no maximum capacity, equip them with resources and information to enhance their children's academic success, and empower them to advocate effectively for their children's needs.

Financial Impact

The additional cost to provide these services is \$55,000. To be paid from the 2024-2025 EDI LCAP budget.
