Hello All,

The 2024 election is over, and some things are more clear than others. Here is what we do know:

- Donald Trump will be the 47th President of the United States
- The Maine federal delegation is projected to remain the same:
 - a. Senator Angus King
 - b. Senator Susan Collins (up for election in 2026)
 - b. Representative Chellie Pingree
 - c. Representative Jared Golden (expected, ranked choice retabulation pending)



- The Maine State Senate has a Democrat majority of 20-13
- The Maine State House of Representatives has a Democrat majority of at least 76-72
- The Education and Cultural Affairs Committee will continue to have Democrat House and Senate chairs
- The Education and Cultural Affairs Committee will have a different makeup
 - a. Heidi Sampson termed out
 - b. Rebecca Millet did not run for re-election
 - c. Ed Polewarczyk did not win re-election
 - d. Mark Worth did not win re-election

We recognize that there is still quite a bit of uncertainty about what the overall election results will mean. As the Leg. Team and I learn more, we will be sure to share with you all.
