

Celebrating Pride at Chicago Public Schools:

Chicago Public Schools is committed to making safe and affirming spaces for all LGBTQ+ students and staff in all schools. CPS demonstrates support for LGBTQ+ students and staff in many ways. For example, the CPS Five-Year Vision (pg.18) goal is for every school to have a Gender and Sexuality Alliance (GSA) by 2024. Celebrating Pride month as a school is in alignment with CPS' mission for every student to feel safe and supported by their school community.

FAQs

What is Pride?

"Pride is more than just a month of celebrations and recognition of the LGBTQ+ community. It's a protest and a fight for equality. It's collaboration and support across other marginalized communities." (GLSEN)

How do I celebrate Pride in the Classroom/School?

- Include LGBTQ+ History in your curricula
- Put PRIDE Flags, pictures of LGBTQ+ figures, and other supportive materials on school walls/bulletins
- Start or co-sponsor a GSA (Gender & Sexuality Alliance)
- Host a Pride Week (for example, on Monday: dress as your favorite LGBTQ+ character/icon)
- Request <u>pronoun pins or OUT for Safe Schools Badges</u> from the Office of Student Health & Wellness

Can I teach LGBTQ+ History in the classroom?

Yes! The state of Illinois requires <u>teaching LGBTQ+ History in all Illinois Public Schools</u>. As a federally and state-funded district, we must include LGBTQ+ history into our curriculum and lessons. The teaching of LGBTQ+ history allows LGBTQ+ students to see themselves reflected in the curriculum. It allows other students to learn about different communities and become more respectful and



affirming of others.

Can students opt-out of LGBTQ+ inclusive curriculum?

No. Per state law, parents/guardians can opt out their student(s) from the Sexual Health Education Curriculum. This law does not apply to other LGBTQ+ inclusive curricula.

Can I put Pride flags and other LGBTQ+ affirming materials in my classroom? Yes! We encourage you to do so!

How do I handle parent/caregiver pushback when teaching LGBTQ+ history / Pride celebrations?

- Inform parents/caregivers about the District's non-discrimination policy, <u>Guidelines Regarding the Support of Transgender and Gender</u> <u>Nonconforming Students</u>, <u>Title IX</u>, and the <u>Illinois state mandate of</u> teaching LGBTQ+ history.
- Numerous studies have demonstrated that LGBTQ+ inclusive curriculum and school policies are associated with lower rates of peer victimization and higher attendance rates for ALL students due to a decrease in safety concerns.
