

Grow Your Own Grant – Secondary Student Pathway

- Encourage secondary students (especially students of color and American Indian students) to pursue teaching
- Percentage of students of color or American Indian students must be the same as or greater than that of the district
- Examples of proposed uses of funds in the RPF included:
 - Support future teacher clubs or service-learning opportunities
 - Provide direct support for students of color or American Indian students in PSEO courses
 - Offer scholarships to graduating high school students of color or American Indian students (for PELSB-approved undergrad teacher prep programs)

Grow Your Own Grant – Secondary Student Pathway


- \$750,000 over **4 years** (through June 2027)
 - **GOAL:** 100 students of color and/or Indigenous across the MEP Districts interested in being teachers
- High school sophomores, juniors, and seniors
- Rolling Application now in place

MEP Grow Your Own Advisory Council

- Guide the overall direction of the project – **key decision-making entity**
- Assist with development of marketing efforts
- Develop application process
- Determine and implement process for reviewing applications
- Select Teachers of Tomorrow and Teaching Fellows (Adult Pathway)
- Select individual or entity to serve as the Navigator for Adult Pathway
- Review project data and suggest project/work plan adjustments based on data

MEP Teachers of Tomorrow Framework

- Nine key components
- “Choice with Support” model – only required component for students are the advising meetings with the Navigator (#1)
- Not creating all new programming – building on what’s underway.
- Navigator is the connector.

Navigator Role - 1 in each MEP District

Meet at least every other week with each Scholar in their community

Connect with support services (including tutoring, accessing jobs/internships, etc.)

Three family contacts per year

Assist with course registration and college applications

Assist with FAFSA application

Assist with group college visits

Grow Your Own Grant – Adult Pathway

- \$750,000 over 5 years (through June 2028)
 - **GOAL:** 15 individuals of color or Indigenous
 - Applicants from across MEP districts
- Must be current employees of one of the districts, reside in the district boundaries, graduated from MEP district, or parent of an MEP student
- 1st Round Application Timelines – November 10, 2023 & March 10, 2024



Adult Pathway MEP Teaching Fellows Model

- Up to \$10,000/year for tuition support or stipends (determined by each Fellow)
- “Choice with Support” model – Fellows pick which MN college/university they attend (must be PELSB-approved program)
- Fellows meet every other week with a **Navigator (1 position across MEP)**
- Each Fellow is also paired with a Mentor Teacher in the area of their teaching interest (preference for teacher of color); check-in monthly
 - Mentors paid \$1,500 for mentoring a Fellow throughout entire program (not per year).

Grant Actions/Activities

- extensive outreach about the courses (in English, Spanish & Somali) to students, parents/guardians, and the wider community
- biweekly navigation support for the students in the class to help ensure their success (connected to GYO grant action)
- connections with tutoring/support resources
- addition of an “Introduction to Early Childhood” Concurrent Enrollment offering – researching possibility of Introduction to Special Education/Exceptional Learners
- free four-day Summer Future Teacher Academy residency at MNSU, Mankato campus
- assistance with identifying, applying to, and securing financial aid for postsecondary education (with an emphasis on schools with teacher prep programs)
- extensive evaluation to ensure the project has a focus on continuous improvement throughout (including focus groups each semester with students and families, course evaluations for students & parents, and regular family contacts)
- ADDITION of Stipends for Peer Tutoring*


Peer Tutoring * (MDE piloting with grant)

- \$350 stipend up to 70 students enrolled in or previous students of the concurrent enrollment Intro to Education to serve as peer tutors
 - Practice skills acquired in the concurrent enrollment course(s), gain increased clarity on their level of interest in pursuing a teaching career.
 - Support 30 peer tutors in Year 1 and 40 in Year 2.
- Priority to students from underrepresented and prioritized groups outlined in original grant proposal (District determined)
 - Students of Color or Indigenous Students
 - First Generation
 - Qualifies for Educational Benefits
- Stipends will be awarded to students who provide at least 20 hours of peer tutoring during the year and complete short reflection components on the experience
- **Stipend payment set up through Healthy Community Initiative**
 - In District Navigator communicate who Peer Tutors are

GYO Student Pathway & CE Enrollment Grant Cross Over
