This necessary metamorphosis is always available to us, when we remember to turn towards it. Join Susan Raffo, Autumn Brown, and Rabbi Jessica Rosenberg to explore the roots of our resistance, and vision into the transformations of ourselves, our relationships, and community that this time is making possible for us. This space will include invitations to song, discussion, and reflection practices.

Free Palestine, Melt ICE (Panel) - Minneapolis Organizers for Palestine

The conditions that enable the occupation and genocide in Palestine, and the deportation regime here on Turtle Island are similar and mutually reinforcing. Join organizers from the movements for justice in Palestine and to abolish ICE to unpack our current, changing conditions in these intertwined fronts of struggle, to strategize, and to vision what is possible when we understand ourselves in and organize from the intersections. Poetry is often used in movement spaces for healing and processing what we're going through, but in the spirit of this week of action, it can *also* be a force for advocacy, education, and mobilization. In this workshop for poets and non-poets alike, we'll explore some of the specific tools and tactics that creative writers use to give their words weight. Kyle Tran Myhre (aka Guante) is a poet and educator based in Minneapolis. A member of two National Poetry Slam championship teams, he's also been featured on a Grammy-winning album, performed at the United Nations, and visited countless colleges, conferences, and festivals, using spoken word and storytelling as doorways into dialogue.

Workplace Organizing in the Occupation - Red Pine Revolutionary Collective

This session is about reducing the number of abductions. We will share our experiences turning our workplaces into sites of anti-Occupation struggle, including rideshare chats, mutual aid, marches on the boss, and strikes. Hosted by a graduate of the Electric Frontier Foundation's "Security Training for Trainers" cohort, this session centers on digital security and surveillance self defense. Grounded in a harm reduction and repression resiliency framework, participants will be introduced to the technologies of the surveillance state in 2026, and be offered practical steps to help keep their communities (and themselves!) safe and resilient.

Two Rising Tides: a Movement Discussion with Ricardo Levins Morales - Ricardo Levins Morales

Organizer, healer, trickster, and artist Ricardo Levins Morales situates the present moment – both the fascist threat and the grassroots resistance – within the historic cycles of which it is part.

Introduction to Sanctuary Schools - Take Action MN

This is a training about how to set up a Sanctuary School team. Sanctuary school teams are a combination of educators and caregivers who do daily protective presence and rapid response around schools, coordinate mutual aid (rides, food relief, rent relief, legal support) and organize together for longer term demands like returning Sanctuary status to schools and abolishing ICE. Come learn from caregivers and organizers about how we started these teams and have grown them at hundreds of schools in districts across the state.

Prairieland Defendants Information and Letter Writing Session - Prairieland Defendant Solidarity

Thursday 2/26, 3pm - HAUMC, Church of Youth

Come learn about and write letters to the Prairieland Defendants, a political repression case stemming from a protest in solidarity with ICE Detainees that occurred on July 4th at the Prairieland Detention Center in Alvarado, Texas, south of Fort Worth. Prairieland is a test case for all who resist; the state's narrative of "antifa terrorism" and life-altering federal and state charges is not just repression of migrants, but also normalizing secret police in all of our cities.

Rides Coordination 101 - Twin Cities' Ride Coordinators

In a time where people are most often getting abducted while waiting for the bus or driving to work, giving neighbors rides has proved a crucial intervention to ICE's strategy and to keeping our communities safe. Join rides coordinators from around the cities for a conversation on what's worked and what hasn't, plus plenty of time for Q&A.

To the Roots! The Current Crisis in Context - Movement School

Why is this happening, and how did we get here? Together we will develop a historical and theoretical analysis of exploitation, and conclude that to keep our communities safe, the border has to go.

Block Ice Block Parties: Reclaim the Street for Connection and Protection! - Twin Cities Neighbors

Learn from experiments throughout the Twin Cities to take back our streets amidst this Federal Occupation. We will talk about why and how the streets are a crucial pillar upholding authoritarianism and share how neighbors can throw their own Block ICE Block Parties to build structures of care for the long haul.

Eviction Defense is Community Defense - Twin Cities Tenants' Union

Thursday 2/26, 5pm - HAUMC, Sanctuary

The threat of displacement from homes that people have been sheltering in and protected within continues the work of occupation and abductions by another means. In Minneapolis, ICE incidents occurred at or within two blocks of public schools every single day for 6 weeks straight. We responded by running about 3000 patrol shifts per week, and that doesn't even include private schools, charter schools or day cares. Come learn from local patrol teams about how to set up protective presence around your school and support a few of the hardest hit schools to have strong patrols while students when some students are just returning from virtual learning.
